H1N1 flu vaccinations available to children in more age groups later this week

The Sarasota County Health Department (SCHD) in partnership with school district officials will provide H1N1 vaccines to children beginning at **six months of age through grade 5** at vaccine clinics this **Friday, Nov. 13 from 3 to 7 p.m.** at Emma Booker, Tuttle, and Ashton elementary schools in Sarasota, and at Laurel Nokomis school, and Garden and Cranberry elementary schools in southern Sarasota County. H1N1 vaccines will also be available to pre-school children (beginning at **six months of age**) through **grade 12** on **Saturday, Nov. 14 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.** at Laurel Nokomis School, and Cranberry Elementary as well as at the Sarasota County Health Department's Ringling Boulevard and Children's Health Clinic at 17th Street in Sarasota.

All children and students must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian. Middle and high school students who have parental consent forms have the option of getting vaccinated at their school sometime later this month. Health officials say that the Saturday H1N1 vaccination clinics are open to those who want to ensure that their middle school and high school-age children get vaccinated prior to Thanksgiving. The vaccine clinics are open to children who attend public and private schools as well as home-schooled students.

Parents should bring the consent form with them when they accompany their child/children to these vaccination sites. The form may be downloaded from the Sarasota County Health Department and Sarasota County School District web sites, www.sarasotahealth.org and www.sarasotacountyschools.net

PAGE TWO - School-based H1N1 flu vaccination clinics continue

“Last week, we had an orderly flow of families coming to the vaccine clinics, and immunized almost 3,500 school-age children across the county. Parents are reminded that the vaccine will be available both days so they can take their time in getting to the clinics,” said Chuck Henry, incident commander for the county’s H1N1 vaccination response. To avoid traffic congestion during school dismissal times, parents are urged to wait until 4 p.m. or later on Friday, or until Saturday where vaccine will be available at selected sites. Law enforcement officers will be available to direct traffic and assist in keeping the flow of people coming into the parking lots orderly.
